

2021 HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION APPLICATION DEADLINE: April 2, 2021

PURPOSE OF THE WESTERN COLORADO MIGRANT AND RURAL COALITION

The purpose of the WCMRC is to improve the work conditions and quality of life of the MFSW (defined as migrant and seasonal farm workers) and their families in the areas of health, education, housing, employment and legal issues. The WCMRC works to maximize the coordination of resources, promotes inter-agency cooperation and attempts to increase community awareness of issues and public programs affecting the MSFW population.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

- Applicant must currently be a senior attending Montrose County or Delta County schools, and be
 enrolled into an institute of higher education or career readiness for the 2021-22 school year to receive
 the scholarship award.
- Student must demonstrate financial need and be a temporary or seasonal agricultural worker or the child of a current temporary or seasonal worker within the last 3 years. (See personal essay prompt).
- If chosen to receive the WCMRC scholarship, funds will be remitted directly to the student for assistance with costs for higher education (university, technical school, certificate program, etc.) including but not limited to tuition, textbooks, transportation and daily living expenses. The award will be delivered in a single payment and *shall not exceed \$2,500.00*
- The award is intended for costs incurred during the 2021-2022 school calendar.
- The scholarship may be renewed for an additional school year pending review of student's academic progress; Award recipients must maintain a 3.0 GPA or above while enrolled in a post-secondary institution and communicate with the WCMRC before the award may be considered for renewal.

• Typed, 12 pt. font, double-spaced not to exceed two pages in length. Applicant must address the essay prompt.

Copy of High School Transcripts

• Priority will be given to applicants with a 2.5 GPA or above. Applicant may address their academic strengths and/or challenges within their personal essay.
